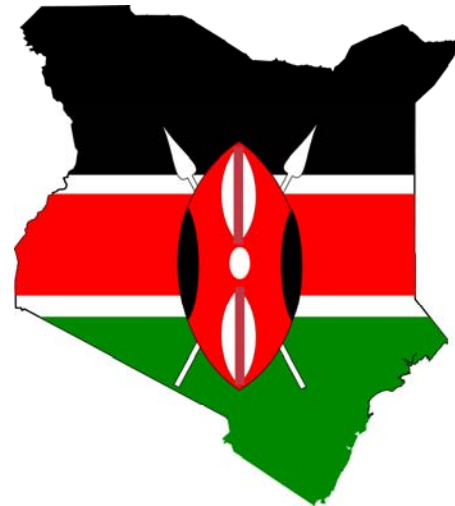

## Achieve:

- ✓ Better Development Impacts
- ✓ Increased Aid Effectiveness
- ✓ Better 'Returns' on Investments /Cost-Benefit
- ✓ Reduced Fragmentation and Transaction Costs of interventions

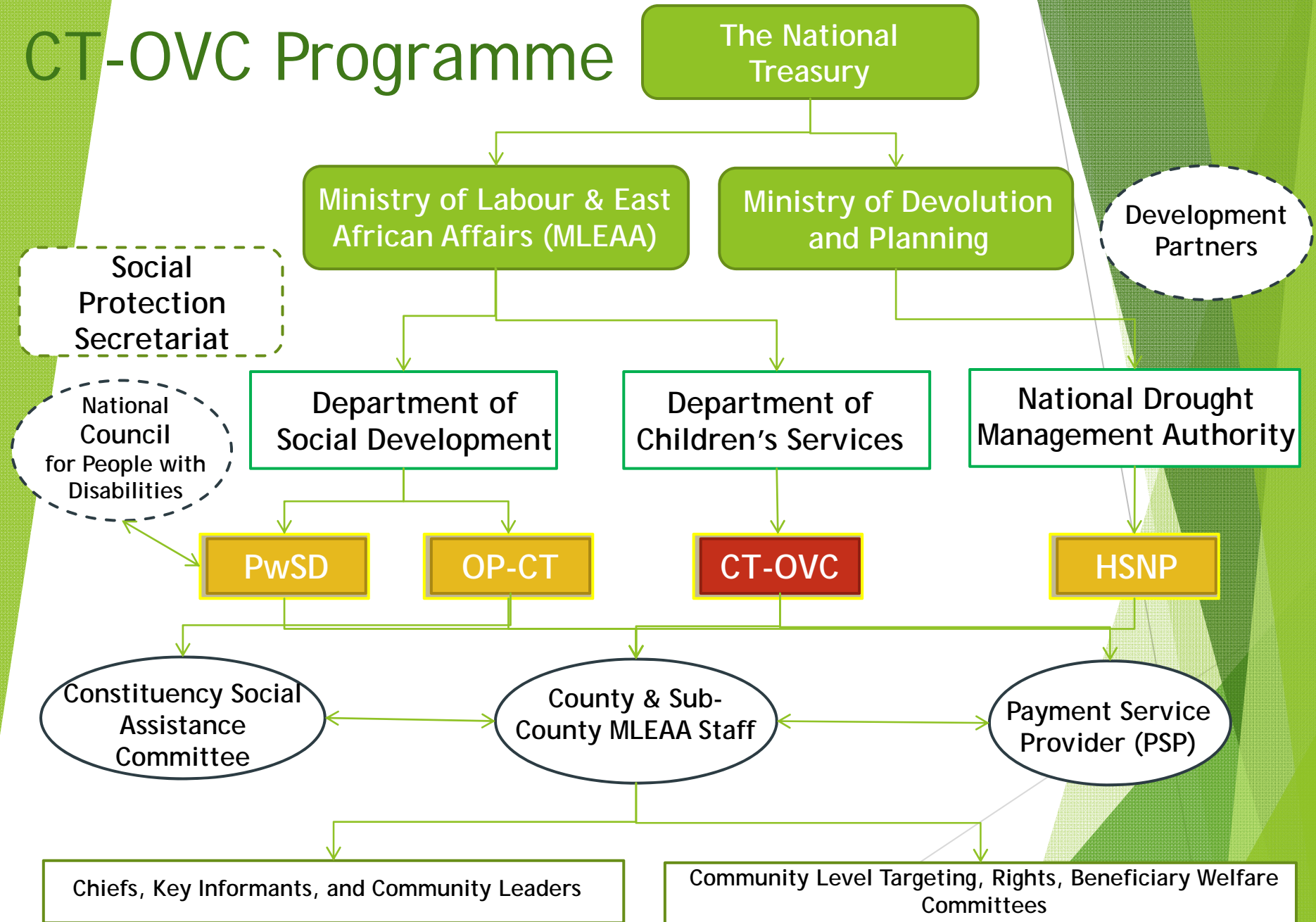
## How?

- ✓ Avoid Duplication/Alignment of Approaches, Strategies and Procedures - Inter-Agency and with National Development Plans and Coordination Mechanisms;
- ✓ Enhanced Knowledge Exchange and Scaling Up of Sustainable, Scalable, Evidence-Based Interventions.

# Coordination Challenges

## **POLICY & GOVERNANCE**

Existing Social Protection Policy

but between the different programmes, there are:

- Different Reporting Lines by Different Ministries;
- Different Funding Channels
- Different Priorities IN Government, BY Government and BY Donors



# Coordination Challenges

## DELIVERY

Existing functioning delivery mechanisms, however there are:

- Duplication (number of beneficiaries, geographic targeting);
- Delivery of programmes by NGOs, civil society not captured in the system
- Local Capacity Constraints:
  - Understaffed;
  - Multiple Portfolio;
  - Limited Decision Making Authority

# Way Forward

- ✓ Development of the Single Social Registry for all the SSN Programmes
- ✓ Creation of an Independent Agency (IA) to manage all the Existing SSN Programmes
- ✓ Inclusion of NGOs, Civil Society in the SP Secretariat and Technical Working Groups
- ✓ Strengthen Staffing at County and Sub-Country levels
