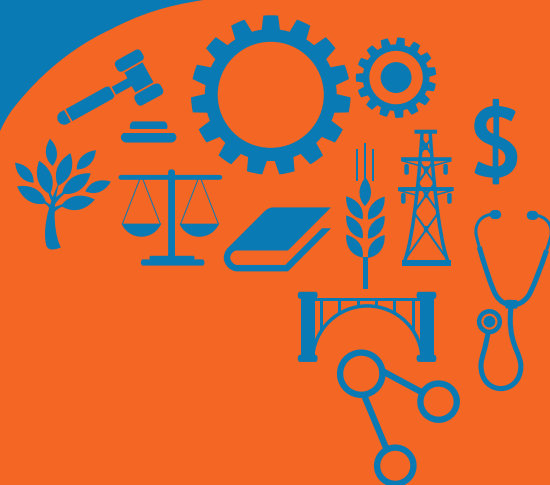

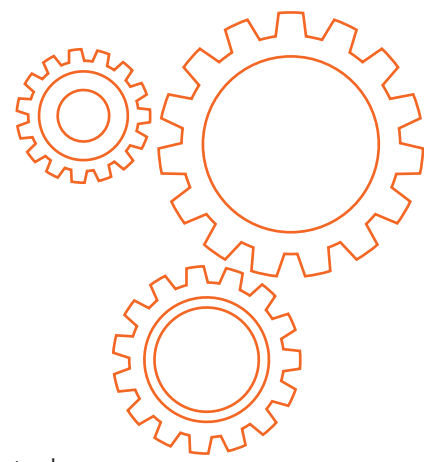

# BIOMETRIC MIRROR INSTALLATION

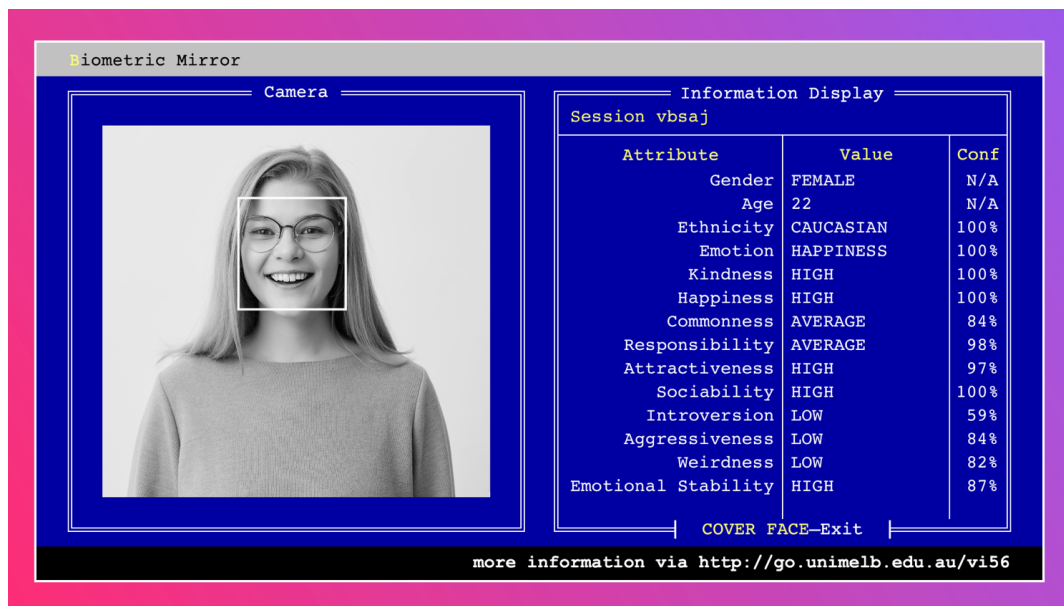
## LOCATION: MC ATRIUM

An ethically provocative interactive installation that enables public participation in the debate around ethics and Artificial Intelligence. Participants are invited to have their face photographed and witness the reveal of their psychometric analysis, including attributes such as aggressiveness, weirdness and emotional instability. Ultimately, a personalized scenario of algorithmic decision-making is shown in order to stimulate individual reflection on the ethical application of artificial intelligence.

**Biometric Mirror is a research project to explore attitudes towards facial analysis and automated decision-making.**

Data captured by the cameras and displayed on the screen is anonymised and securely transmitted. All data is erased irreversibly upon terminating interactions. Data cannot be used to personally identify you or passersby. You can step out of the camera frame to make all information disappear from the screen immediately.

The research is being conducted by researchers at Interaction Design Lab at the University of Melbourne, with support from Science Gallery Melbourne.
