Thank you for your letter of April 10. I, too, enjoyed our luncheon and I look forward to having your views on the situation in Ghana.

I was very pleased to have a copy of the Bank's letter to Mr. Frondizi and the reference in it to the periodic economic reports which the Bank does on a number of countries prompts me to ask whether it would be possible for you to send me copies of these reports as they become available.

Naturally, I am quite sympathetic to the approach which you took to President Frondizi but I must say it does leave some question in one's mind as to how viable a very tight economic policy is in a country which has as volatile a political situation as does Argentina. In other words, a certain amount of resources, I dare say, will have to be expended on projects which will not have the greatest favorable impact on economic recovery and growth as, for instance, housing developments. Nevertheless, I certainly do agree with the thrust of your letter to Argentina. I hope on your return we will be able to talk about this at greater length.

Meanwhile, I want to thank you very much for your courtesy in letting me share this letter.
