Agenda Item 2

Problems of Allocation and Disbursement

The Consultative Group on International Agricultural Research now includes 15 governments and organizations which have indicated an intention to make grants in 1973 to support programs of international agricultural research endorsed by the Group. The entities expecting to receive support include four ongoing centers, two centers that will start becoming operational in 1973, and one or more activities that will be entering an initial phase of development during the year. Commitments are required for at least three different types of expenditure: for annual costs of core programs; for multi-year programs of construction and equipment acquisition; and for project development.

The members of the Group therefore must fit their efforts into a rather elaborate mosaic of grants, centers and differing types of financial commitment. This is an inherently complicated process. It is further complicated by special factors. Donors differ among themselves in the timing and procedures for planning, committing and disbursing research grants. Many members of the Consultative Group have yet to establish patterns of year-to-year support for particular centers. On the horizon are new enterprises for which no pattern of support exists at all.

The operations of the Consultative Group in 1972 have illustrated the nature and importance of the difficulties these factors can cause. On the donor side, the difficulties are of three kinds.

One difficulty arises from differences in the procedures whereby donors obtain funds for agricultural research grants. Some donors, in effect, can obtain funds from their governing bodies at any time. Most, however, are dependent on parliaments and annual cycles of planning and appropriation. The research centers themselves operate on the basis of calendar years. Many donors, however, act on the basis of fiscal years which do not begin until three months or more after the beginning of the calendar year. The dates on which legislatures actually appropriate funds, shown illustratively in the attached table, are still more variable. In 1972, out of \$15 million which donors indicated they intended to grant for this year, some \$2.6 million -- about 17 per cent -- had not been funded with actual appropriations as late as June 1.

Secondly, there are difficulties of allocation. As late as June 1. out of \$15 million of intended grants, \$1.2 million (consisting partly of funds not yet appropriated) had not been earmarked for specific centers and activities. New donors, not unnaturally, were slow in deciding what centers to support, and at the beginning of the year, some had no established procedures for making such decisions. The earmarking decided on, moreover, was not always consistent with the needs of the centers or the allocations proposed by other donors. During the first half of the year, about \$1 million of proposed allocations were inconsistent with center needs or with each other.

Finally, there is a third set of difficulties arising from the variability of disbursement procedures followed by donors. Some donors make funds available in single advance payments. Others make quarterly or semi-annual advance payments. Some payments are made only in reimbursement of expenditures already made.

The combination of delays in allocations, delays in the availability of funds and differences in disbursement procedures has a major impact on the transfer of funds to the centers. While detailed figures are not available, it seems likely that out of the \$15 million of indicated grants,

by the end of the first half of the year only about a third had been transferred to the centers.

The resulting shortfalls and eccentricities of cash flow have not affected the centers uniformly. In the first half of the year, most centers had adequate funds. But in some cases, there have been distortions and delays in research and training programs caused by the necessity to defer staff appointments, postpone construction or omit planned activities of other kinds; and the centers have had to spend time and energy on insufficient stop-gap solutions.

Remedial approaches

A number of measures, taken together, might do much to harmonize the operations in the Consultative Group and make them more effective.

The performance of the Group might improve considerably if participants and beneficiaries were working within a time framework in which indications of donor intent could be given much earlier than has been the case in the Group's first year. Existing centers already have initiated a procedure under which they present not only a firm budget for the next year but indicate probable requirements for subsequent years. Estimates for the first and second years of the series, at least, can be regarded as reasonably firm.

The members of the Consultative Group, on their side, might be prepared, at the same time as they indicate their intentions for a first year, to give the Group Secretariat tentative indications about a second, in terms of total grants and of possible allocations to ongoing centers and new enterprises within those totals. The Consultative Group would thereby be enabled to perceive, a year in advance, possible conflicts in allocations and shortfalls in the availability of funds, and discussions

of adjustments could begin in good time.

Within a 2-year time frame, a donor's decisions concerning agricultural research grants in any given year would represent a final consideration of matters already given preliminary thought in the preceding year. In any case, the end result should be that definitive discussions of research grants between members of the Group and the Secretariat could begin as early as July preceding the year in which they are to be effective. Normally, final decisions about grants would then be made by the time of the annual meeting of the Consultative Group in October or November.

It should also be recognized that 'ff all donors were to insist on their first choices for research grants, a serious mis-allocation of funds might well result, with some activities being over-funded and others left in serious deficit. It would be helpful, therefore, if donors, throughout their consideration of allocations to the centers, were prepared to take over-all patterns of requirements into account and to be flexible in their final allocations. It would also be helpful if donors, in giving indications of their intentions, could identify what part of their grants faced some risk of not becoming available within the intended time period.

It should further be emphasized, as it has been in previous discussions within the Consultative Group, that grants for core budgets, whenever possible, should be given on an unrestricted basis, thereby allowing greater flexibility within centers.

Temporary Financing

It may be that the difficulties experienced with the appropriation of funds for research grants in 1972 -- involving unusual delays in the parliamentary processes of two donor governments -- were exceptional. On the other hand, with as many as nine governments now included among donors, the

possibility has to be accepted that in any given year one or two will encounter problems of this kind.

In the absence of specific approval by legislatures, some governments are authorized by existing law or routine parliamentary action to spend funds for purposes authorized in previous years and at levels related to expenditures for these purposes in the preceding year. Such authorizations, however, do not apply to new purposes, nor do they apply to amounts over and above previous rates of expenditure. In 1973, perhaps as much as one-third of the financial requirements to be considered by the members of the Consultative Group will be beyond the reach of this remedy.

The members of the Consultative Group, therefore, might wish to consider making some funds available to a Group Account from which temporary advances could be made to protect the centers against shortfalls arising from delays in appropriations or allocations.

Funding to protect against the two contingencies would not involve the same degree of risk. Money advanced to the centers from the Group Account as a temporary substitute for funds appropriated but not yet allocated by donors would be repaid by the centers as soon as donor allocations had been made and put into effect. There would be little risk in providing this money. On the other hand, advances to the centers from the Group Account pending appropriation of donor grants would face the possibility that the appropriations might not be made, or might be made in amounts less than expected. Funds advanced from the Group Account might therefore not always be repaid, and the Account might experience some attrition over a period of time.

If temporary funds are to be made available, the question arises

whether they should be administered in one account or two. Simplicity would argue for the former, provided that the Consultative Group were prepared to face the risk of attrition involved.

The basic financing of the Account would have to be accomplished only once, since the Account would, in principle, be a revolving fund (although it might have to be augmented marginally from time to time to stay in scale with the operations of the Group, and might occasionally have to be replenished to compensate it for attrition).

Members could initiate the Account by depositing in it, over and above the funds they intend to earmark for specific research activities, some fraction of one year's total allocations for international agricultural research. The Account might be operated for two years and then reviewed to see whether the experiment should be continued.

It is not possible to predict what funds might be used in any given year. In 1972, an amount equal to about one-sixth of grants for the year would have been needed to make up shortages of cash flow that occurred in the first six months.

If in 1973 an Account were created equal to 10 per cent of the estimated financial requirements for that year, the size of the Account might be expected to amount to slightly more than \$2 million. Such an amount would have been about sufficient to maintain a proper cash flow of grants in 1972; it probably would also be adequate for 1973.

Agenda Item 3

Review Procedures

The decisions of the members of the Consultative Group with respect to individual research grants are intended to be taken in the light of recommendations made by the Group's Technical Advisory Committee (TAC).

TAC works in two dimensions, appraising proposals for new research activities and reviewing the progress and effectiveness of existing centers.

It is expected that TAC will undertake in-depth reviews of the work of existing centers only at intervals of several years. At the meeting of the Consultative Group last December, it was agreed that in the interim, TAC would be kept informed, and in turn would advise the Consultative Group, partly on the basis of reviews undertaken by staff of the FAO and the World Bank, two of the sponsoring agencies of the Group.

This procedure may be adequate as far as concerns the examination of budgets for cost efficiency; limited experience already suggests that it is not a fully satisfactory approach with respect to program content, and that it will become still less so as the number of international agricultural research activities increases. In relation to the amount of work to be undertaken and the scope of knowledge required, the manpower available is not altogether adequate. A particular problem is presented by centers with programs in several kinds of production and in agricultural systems as well; review by the one or two experts likely to be available from the sponsoring agencies probably will not do the centers justice. In the case of the Bank, moreover, there is a certain awkwardness in concurrently taking the role of reviewer as well as of donor and chairman of

the Consultative Group.

Some donors, at any rate, want to be informed directly about the programs of centers in which they have a major interest. Some satisfy this wish through membership on the governing boards of the centers. There is not room, however, for all donors to sit on governing boards, and some do not wish to.

Two centers (CIMMYT and IITA), therefore, have recently initiated the practice of appointing panels of outside experts to review their work. The report of each panel is made to the trustees of the center in question, and is incorporated in the over-all findings of the trustees with respect to the progress of the center. To the extent that such reports may be modified by the trustees, they may not altogether meet the needs of those members of the Consultative Group who must satisfy national legislatures that grant programs are based on an independent appraisal.

It appears possible, nevertheless, that present external review procedures, with slight modifications, could adequately serve both donors and centers. For instance, the selection of members of the external review panel might be approved by the Consultative Group or by TAC. And the reports of the panels might be made directly available to the members of the Group and to TAC (as already is the case with CIMMYT) as well as to the trustees of the center involved.

Donors might also explicitly accept the idea that external reviews, whenever and however conducted, would not necessarily concern all of a center's work each year. Over-all reviews might be held only every two or three years, with the intervening years perhaps used for an in-depth examination of some significant segment or segments of the center's work.

Members of the Consultative Group are asked to express views on this question. An acceptable solution, needless to say, is highly desirable for both substantive and administrative reasons — not least for the reason that, in the absence of a solution, center staffs will be heavily burdened by the necessity of dealing with a multiplicity of visiting donor delegations seeking much the same information.

Agenda Item 4

A Financial Framework

The decisions of the members of the Consultative Group in one year have implications for the years following. Agreement by the Group that support for a center is desirable implies a willingness by members of the Group to consider the financial requirements of that center over a period of years. Since the resources of the Group have limits, each new center to some extent competes with existing centers for available finance. In the meantime, the requirements of existing centers also may be increasing and competing with each other. The possibility exists, therefore, that a decision taken now to support a particular research activity will, some years from now, make it difficult or impossible to give adequate support to a new proposal which clearly has higher priority.

In principle, then, it might be desirable for members of the Consultative Group collectively to indicate for some years into the future what the total of available resources may be. Some donors, in fact, at the meeting of the Group last December, were able to give indications of their intentions over a span of as many as five years — subject, of course, to continuing review and to the action of parliaments.

Members of the Group are now asked whether they wish to consider the possibility of projecting on a provisional basis and over some period of years (say three to five), over-all financial limits within which the Technical Advisory Committee would make its recommendations and the Group would make its judgments. For such a projection, it would be necessary for individual members tentatively to indicate levels of finance they may be prepared to consider in future, and over what span of years.

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

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

Problems of Allocation and Disbursement

The Consultative Group on International Agricultural Research now includes 15 governments and organizations which have indicated an intention to make grants in 1973 to support programs of international agricultural research centers endorsed by the Group. The entities expecting to receive support include four ongoing centers, two centers that will start becoming operational in 1973, and one or more activities that will be entering an initial phase of development during the year. Commitments are required for at least three different types of expenditure: for annual running costs; for multi-year programs of construction and equipment acquisition; and for project development.

The members of the Group therefore must fit their efforts into a rather elaborate mosaic of grants, centers and differing types of financial commitment. This is an inherently complicated process. It is further complicated by special factors. Donors differ among themselves in the timing and procedures for planning, committing and disbursing research grants. Many members of the Consultative Group have yet to establish patterns of year-to-year support for particular centers. On the horizon are new enterprises for which no pattern of support exists at all.

The operations of the Consultative Group in 1972 have illustrated the nature and importance of the difficulties these factors can cause. On the donor side, the difficulties are of three kinds.

One difficulty arises from differences in the procedures whereby

donors obtain funds for agricultural research grants. Some donors, in effect, can obtain funds from their governing bodies at any time. Most, however, are dependent on parliaments and annual cycles of planning and appropriation. The research centers themselves operate on the basis of calendar years. Many donors, however, act on the basis of fiscal years which do not begin until three months or more after the beginning of the calendar year. The dates on which legislatures actually appropriate funds, shown illustratively in the attached table, are still more variable. In 1972, out of \$15 million which donors indicated they intended to grant for this year, some \$2.6 million — about 17 per cent — had not been funded with actual appropriations as late as June 1.

Secondly, there are difficulties of allocation. As late as June 1, out of \$15 million of intended grants, \$1.2 million (consisting partly of funds not yet appropriated) had not been earmarked for specific centers and activities. New donors, not unnaturally, were slow in deciding what centers to support, and at the beginning of the year, some had no established procedures for making such decisions. The earmarking decided on, moreover, was not always consistent with the needs of the centers or the allocations proposed by other donors. During the first half of the year, about \$1 million of proposed allocations were inconsistent with center needs or with each other.

Finally, there is a third set of difficulties arising from the variability of disbursement procedures followed by donors. Some donors make funds available in single advance payments. Others make quarterly or semi-annual advance payments. Some payments are made only in reimbursement of expenditures already made.

The combination of delays in allocations, delays in the availability

of funds and differences in disbursement procedures has a major impact on the transfer of funds to the centers. While detailed figures are not available, it seems likely that out of the \$15 million of indicated grants, by the end of the first half of the year only about a third had been transferred to the centers.

The resulting shortfalls and eccentricities of cash flow have not affected the centers uniformly. In the first half of the year, most centers had adequate funds. But in some cases, there have been distortions and delays in research and training programs caused by the necessity to defer staff appointments, postpone construction or omit planned activities of other kinds; and the centers have had to spend time and energy on insufficient stop-gap solutions.

Remedial approaches

A number of measures, taken together, might do much to harmonize the operations in the Consultative Group and make them more effective.

The performance of the Group might improve considerably if participants and beneficiaries were working within a time framework in which indications of donor intent could be given much earlier than has been the case in the Group's first year. It seems worth while to consider establishing a procedure under which centers in one year would present not only a firm budget for the next year, but would indicate requirements for a year beyond that: in mid-1973, for instance, centers might present a firm budget for 1974 and tentative estimates for 1975 as well.

The members of the Consultative Group, on their side, might be prepared, at the same time as they indicate their intentions for a first year, to give the Group Secretariat tentative indications about a second, in terms of total grants and of possible allocations to ongoing centers and new enterprises within those totals. The Consultative Group would thereby be enabled to perceive, a year in advance, possible conflicts in allocations and shortfalls in the availability of funds, and discussions of adjustments could begin in good time.

Within a 2-year time frame, a donor's decisions concerning agricultural research grants in any given year would represent a final consideration of matters already given preliminary thought in the preceding year. In any case, the end result should be that definitive discussions of research grants between members of the Group and the Secretariat could begin as early as July preceding the year in which they are to be effective. Normally, final decisions about grants would then be made by the time of the annual meeting of the Consultative Group in October or November.

It should also be recognized that if all donors were to insist on their first choices for research grants, a serious mis-allocation of funds might well result, with some activities being over-funded and others left in serious deficit. It would be helpful, therefore, if donors, throughout their consideration of allocations to the centers, were prepared to take over-all patterns of requirements into account and to be flexible in their final allocations.

Temporary Financing

It may be that the difficulties experienced with the appropriation of funds for research grants in 1972 -- involving unusual delays in the parliamentary processes of two donor governments -- were exceptional.

On the other hand, with as many as nine governments now included among donors, the possibility has to be accepted that in any given year one or

two will encounter problems of this kind.

In the absence of specific approval by legislatures, some governments are authorized by existing law or routine parliamentary action to spend funds for purposes authorized in previous years and at levels related to expenditures for these purposes in the preceding year. Such authorizations, however, do not apply to new purposes, nor do they apply to amounts over and above previous rates of expenditure. In 1973, perhaps as much as one-third of the financial requirements to be considered by the members of the Consultative Group will be beyond the reach of this remedy.

The members of the Consultative Group, therefore, might wish to consider making some funds available to a Group Account from which temporary advances could be made to protect the centers against shortfalls arising from delays in appropriations or allocations.

Funding to protect against the two contingencies would not involve the same degree of risk. Money advanced to the centers as a temporary substitute for funds appropriated but not yet allocated by donors would be repaid by the centers as soon as donor allocations had been made and put into effect. There would be little risk in providing this money. Advances to the centers pending appropriation of donor grants would face the possibility that the appropriations might not be made, or might be made in amounts less than expected. Funds advanced from the Group Account might therefore not always be repaid, and the Account might experience some attrition over a period of time.

If temporary funds are to be made available, the question arises whether they should be administered in one account or two. Simplicity would argue for the former, provided that the Consultative Group were

prepared to face the risk of attrition involved.

The basic financing of the Account would have to be accomplished only once, since the Account would, in principle, be a revolving fund (although it might have to be augmented marginally from time to time to stay in scale with the operations of the Group, and might occasionally have to be replenished to compensate if for attrition).

Members could initiate the Account by depositing in it, over and above the funds they intend to earmark for specific research activities, some fraction of one year's total allocations for international agricultural research. The Account might be operated for two years and then reviewed to see whether the experiment should be continued.

It is not possible to predict what funds might be used in any given year. In 1972, an amount equal to about one-sixth of grants for the year would have been needed to make up shortages of cash flow that occurred in the first six months.

If in 1973 an Account were created equal to 10 per cent of the estimated financial requirements for that year, the size of the Account might be expected to amount to slightly more than \$2 million. Such an amount would have been about sufficient to maintain a proper cash flow of grants in 1972; it probably would also be adequate for 1973.

Review Procedures

The decisions of the members of the Consultative Group with respect to individual research grants are intended to be taken in the light of recommendations made by the Group's Technical Advisory Committee (TAC).

TAC works in two dimensions, appraising proposals for new research activities and reviewing the progress and effectiveness of existing centers.

It is expected that TAC will undertake in-depth reviews of the work of existing centers only at intervals of several years. At the meeting of the Consultative Group last December, it was agreed that in the interim, TAC would be kept informed, and in turn would advise the Consultative Group, partly on the basis of reviews undertaken by staff of the FAO and the World Bank, two of the sponsoring agencies of the Group.

Limited experience already suggests that perhaps this is not a fully satisfactory approach, and that it will become still less so as the number of international agricultural research activities increases. In relation to the amount of work to be undertaken and the scope of knowledge required, the manpower available is not altogether adequate. A particular problem is presented by centers with programs in several kinds of production and in agricultural systems as well; review by the one or two experts likely to be available from the sponsoring agencies probably will not do the centers justice. In the case of the Bank, moreover, there is a certain awkwardness in concurrently taking the role of reviewer as well as of donor and chairman of the Consultative Group.

Some donors, at any rate, want to be informed directly about the work

of centers in which they have a major interest. Some satisfy this wish through membership on the governing boards of the centers. There is not room, however, for all donors to sit on governing boards, and some do not wish to.

Two centers (CIMMYT and IITA), therefore, have recently initiated the practice of appointing panels of outside experts to review their work. The report of each panel is made to the trustees of the center in question, and is incorporated in the over-all findings of the trustees with respect to the progress of the center. To the extent that such reports may be modified by the trustees, they may not altogether meet the needs of those members of the Consultative Group who must satisfy national legislatures that grant programs are based on an independent appraisal.

It appears possible, nevertheless, that present external review procedures, with slight modifications, could adequately serve both donors and centers. For instance, the selection of members of the external review panel might be approved by the Consultative Group or by TAC. And the report of the panels might be made directly available to the members of the Group and to TAC as well as to the trustees of the center involved.

Members of the Consultative Group are asked to express views on this question. An acceptable solution, needless to say, is highly desirable for both substantive and administrative reasons — not least for the reason that, in the absence of a solution, center staffs will be heavily burdened by the necessity of dealing with a multiplicity of visiting donor delegations seeking much the same information.

A Financial Framework

The decisions of the members of the Consultative Group in one year have implications for the years following. Agreement by the Group that support for a center is desirable implies a willingness by members of the Group to consider the financial requirements of that center over a period of years. Since the resources of the Group have limits, each new center to some extent competes with existing centers for available finance. In the meantime, the requirements of existing centers also may be increasing and competing with each other. The possibility exists, therefore, that a decision taken now to support a particular research activity will, some years from now, make it difficult or impossible to give adequate support to a new proposal which clearly has higher priority.

In principle, then, it might be desirable for members of the Consultative Group collectively to indicate for some years into the future what the total of available resources may be. Some donors, in fact, at the meeting of the Group last December, were able to give indications of their intentions over a span of as many as five years — subject, of course, to continuing review and to the action of parliaments.

Members of the Group are now asked whether they wish to consider the possibility of projecting on a provisional basis and over some period of years (say three to five), over-all financial limits within which the Technical Advisory Committee would make its recommendations and the Group would make its judgments. For such a projection, it would be necessary for individual members tentatively to indicate levels of finance they may be prepared to consider in future, and over what span of years.

Thank you kindly for your note of 30 May. Dick will certainly take note of your remark concerning the Friday morning of Centers Week and we will give the matter further thought.

We are now in the midst of preparing papers (brief) and making conference arrangements (interminable) for Centers Week. Let me report the following with respect to yourself and TAC: As between the Shoreham and the Watergate Hotels, our travel office thought the latter much the better; and you may have noticed from various bits of correspondence that the members of TAC, unless they indicate other wishes, will be housed at the Watergate.

The interpreters' facilities that seem necessary for TAC (involving booths and equipment for three interpreters working simultaneously) cannot be found in the World Bank buildings or neighborhood. They are available, however, at the headquarters of the Panamerican Health Organization, which is just across Virginia Avenue from the Watergate. We are therefore planning for the closed meetings of TAC to be held there; after Tuesday, this will keep you away from the Consultative Group, which may conceivably be an advantage.

In Rome, we had a very brief telephone conversation in which you asked for figures about financial support being given in 1972 to outreach programs. I have been through Arie's files here, and find that we have little that bears directly on this subject. A document (attached) circulated to delegates to the Consultative Group meeting last December mentions assistance to special projects amounting to \$2.9 million (as compared with about \$15.1 million for core and capital budgets). Not all this assistance to special projects is for outreach, however; and not all assistance to outreach is included in the figure; nor do we have in our files the detailed information that would enable us to give you a better figure. I have therefore asked

the principal donors for additional information; it is now beginning to come in, but it may take some further time to arrive and be assembled. In the meantime, my guess is that the figure will be quite a bit more than the amount indicated for special projects.

Thank you for sending the letter from Mr. Cirne Lima of Brazil. I am passing it over to Jim Evans for consideration: there have been some discussions between AID and ourselves concerning research activities in Brazil which should in some way be related to ICRISAT. Jim will no doubt give you information about this; and he will have some suggestions about what kind of substantive reply Mr. Lima should receive. In the meantime, a developmental economist from Brazil

(Mr. Rubens Costa of the National Housing Bank) already has agreed

to serve as a member of the Governing Board of ICRISAT.

TRANSLATION

Dear Vice-Chancellor,

I have been told by Mr William A. Ellis, Director of USAID in Brazil that the World Consultative Group is considering a proposal to establish in tropical dry areas (probably in India) an international centre for agricultural investigation in tropical areas.

The establishment of an international centre does not necessarily prevent the creation of regional centres. The Brazilian Government, which is moving to the introduction of new technologies in tropical areas with the object of increasing production and rentability (?), is placing increasing emphasis on agricultural development in the northeast region of the country where more than 50% of the population and approximately 30 million inhabitants depend on agriculture for their subsistence. I judge therefore that it would be timely for the World Consultative Group to examine the possibility of creating a regional centre for tropical research, locating it for preference in Ceara State.

Although the creation of a regional centre calls for a financial arrangement with the Brazilian Government and specifically calls on it to make available a site, I don't think that this should frustrate the development of the project.

I am asking therfore that you intervene with the Consultative Group to persuade it to send a team to Brazil with the object of examining the possibility of creating a regional centre for agricultural research in the tropical areas in the northeast of the country.

Harold Graves has requested that the Rockefeller and Ford Foundations take responsibility for helping you directors arrange a half-day program for in-house discussions during International Centers Week. Probably, this half-day will occur Wednesday afternoon or Thursday morning. Harold is adjusting the agenda for the meetings to specify a half-day for this purpose.

John Pino and I flipped a coin and I won the opportunity to work with you. with his help, in preparing the agenda for this half-day session.

From the feedback thus far received, I list the following topics as possibilities for inclusion in your session. The purpose of this memo is to seek your additions and deletions that the agenda for that half-day will best serve your needs.

It is assumed that in attendance at your meeting would be you directors plus such members of your governing boards as may be in attendance at International Centers Week. If you desire it otherwise, please let me know. Of course, there would be in addition such resource people as are essential to the agenda you adopt.

Topics thus far suggested include the following:

- 1. Comparative analysis of salary levels, adjustments, perquisites, supplemental fringe benefits such as spouse travel: (a) among the institutes and (b) between the institutes and other international agricultural development assistance entities. It has been proposed that we request William Gormbley to update the comparative analysis which he made some two years ago, extend it to include institutions other than the international centers and be prepared to lead us in discussing this package of items. I have taken the liberty of asking Mr. Gormbley to launch his survey and have requested that he clear his schedule to meet with us on August 2 or 3, whichever date is set for our group meeting.
- 2. Relationships of the International Centers with the consultative group and with the technical advisory committee. Suggested lead discussant, Rd ph Cummings (I nominate Ralph because he, perhaps more than other of the directors has participated in meetings of TAX in his role as developer of ICRISAT.)

- 3. Considerations in operating a portion of a center's core research program in a location other than the host country. Suggested lead discussant, Haldore Hanson.
- 4. Development and maintenance of institute policy with respect to study leaves and professional meeting participation by "permanent" staff members. Suggested lead discussant, Robert Chandler. (While in a very real sense sabbatic or study leaves are a portion of the fringe benefits, this topic may usefully be discussed as a separate item.)
 - 5. Institute relationships to members of the governing boards -- committee structure, membership succession, recruitment of new members and related matters. Suggested lead discussant, F. F. Hill.
 - 6. Program budget accounting considerations and procedures. Suggested lead discussant, Michael Ruddy.
 - 7. IIE relationships. Any questions or suggestions should be discussed while Mr. Gormbley is present.

Thank you for your letter of May 22 in which you gave us indications about technical requirements you will need for the TAC meeting.

Meeting room facilities:

As you will probably have noticed from the Provisional Agenda we distributed two weeks ago, we have reserved our Conference Room C 1006 for the TAC meeting. This Conference Room has full interpretation facilities and provides sufficient room for the TAC members and observers.

Interpreters:

TRANSLATION

Dear Vice-Chancellor,

I have been told by Mr William A. Ellis, Director of USAID in Brazil that the World Consultative Group is considering a proposal to establish in tropical dry areas (probably in India) an international centre for agricultural investigation in tropical areas.

The establishment of an international centre does not necessarily prevent the creation of regional centres. The Brazilian Government, which is moving to the introduction of new technologies in tropical areas with the object of increasing production and rentability (?), is placing increasing emphasis on agricultural development in the northeast region of the country where more than 50% of the population and approximately 30 million inhabitants depend on agriculture for their subsistence. I judge therefore that it would be timely for the World Consultative Group to examine the possibility of creating a regional centre for tropical research, locating it for preference in Ceara State.

Although the creation of a regional centre calls for a financial arrangement with the Brazilian Government and specifically calls on it to make available a site, I don't think that this should frustrate the development of the project.

I am asking therefore that you intervene with the Consultative Group to persuade it to send a team to Brazil with the object of examining the possibility of creating a regional centre for agricultural research in the tropical areas in the northeast of the country.

With this letter, I am sending you a copy of the Provisional Agenda for International Centers Week.

You will notice that the Agenda provides that plenary sessions will discuss the work of the research Centers and Institutes during the first two days of the Week (Monday, July 31, and Tuesday, August 1). Institute personnel should also expect to be involved in meetings on the third and fourth days (Wednesday, August 2 and Thursday, August 3), but probably not on the fifth and last day.

On Wednesday, August 2, and Thursday, August 3, you will notice, TAC will be meeting in closed session, and the members of the Consultative Group will be meeting informally among themselves. On the Wednesday, it may be that the members of the Consultative Group, as a group, will wish to continue the discussions with the Institutes that were begun in the plenary sessions. Also on Wednesday, representatives of individual Institutes may be asked to meet with TAC.

It is possible that some of these Wednesday meetings will carry on into Thursday. We rather expect, however, that Thursday will be available for discussions among Institute representatives on common problems. We have asked the Ford and Rockefeller Foundations to organize this segment of the program, and we expect that they will be in touch with you about it. If you wish to make suggestions in the meantime, I am sure that Dr. Lowell Hardin of the Ford Foundation or Dr. John Pino of the Rockefeller Foundation would be glad to hear from you.

Also on Thursday, we expect, personnel of particular Institutes and representatives of particular donor governments and organizations may find it desirable to meet privately for discussions of their mutual business. We will try to make meeting places available for this purpose.

You will, of course, wish to decide for yourself what would constitute the most effective presentation in the plenary session of the program, objectives, accomplishments and problems of your Institute. You probably should assume some familiarity with the basic facts about your Institute, and it might be well to put your emphasis on current work and new developments in 1972-73. We have scheduled a total time of two hours for each Institute during the plenary sessions, divided equally between a positive presentation by the Institute and a question-and-answer discussion in which we expect that the Chairman and members of TAC will take the lead. On the basis of experience in previous years, however, we suggest that a shorter presentation (of not more than 45 minutes) and a longer discussion period will, in the end, bring about a better understanding of your program. Experience also suggests that a positive presentation by a single person will, in most cases, be more effective than a presentation by several.

We hope that any documents you may wish to place before the meeting can be in the hands of the participants by around July 1, and in any case not later than July 15. These documents should of course include comprehensive information about your program and budget for 1973.

If you intend to distribute your own documentation, we will be glad to send you a list of recipients for that purpose. We would also be glad, if you wish, to prepare the necessary number of copies of your documentation and distribute them from Washington. If you want to follow the latter alternative, you should of course provide us with a set of documents for copying. The number of documents required, in any case, seems to be about 150 of which 100 would be needed for advance distribution and another 50 for a reserve stock in Washington at the time of Centers Week.

If you wish to use slides or motion pictures as part of your presentation, please let us know well in advance so that we can provide the necessary equipment. I will also expect to hear from you if you wish to us to make hotel reservations in Washington for you and any of your colleagues who may be attending Centers Week. In any case, it would be helpful for me to know in advance what persons from your Institute will be attending.

Here is the way the agenda for International Centers Week looks now; it has not been much amended since we talked about it on the telephone just before you went to Bellagio. We took your point about shortening the time of Center presentations and lengthening the time for questions and discussions. While we did not change the schedule, we did suggest in our letters to Center personnel that a presentation of 45 minutes might be better than one which took the full hour allowed.

I am also sending you a copy of a letter sent to Mr. Diouf of WARDA, which implies, at least, that he would be expected to attend the plenary sessions and, if invited, a meeting of TAC, but that other meetings during the week would not concern him.

You will find, as a final bonus, a copy of an UNCTAD resolution which is addressed to the Consultative Group. I have sent a copy (without comment) to Sir John as well.

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

The purpose of this letter is to request the members of the Consultative Group on International Agricultural Research to act on matters concerning the Group's Technical Advisory Committee (TAC).

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It will be recalled that, in 1971, the Consultative Group elected 12 experts as members of the first TAC, one-third of whom were to be replaced or re-elected each year. In order to achieve the proper spacing out of terms, the Committee initially was divided by lot into three groups of four members, one group to serve three years, a second to serve two years, and a third to serve one year. The terms of the third group will expire at the end of June this year. A list of the initial membership of TAC is attached.

TAC, like the Consultative Group itself, is new, but with the benefit of a warming-up period, the members are working well together. To reconstitute a third of TAC's membership so early in its existence would, in the opinion of the co-sponsors of the Consultative Group, be an interruption of continuity that would handicap both the work of TAC and the deliberations of the Group itself. The co-sponsors therefore recommend that, with one exception, the members whose terms are now about to expire be re-elected for a full three-year term ending June 30, 1975.

The exception is Professor Fukuda, who has indicated that he wishes to serve only to the end of his present term and whose specialty has, in any event, not been much called into play. The members who would be re-elected, if you agree, are Dr. Hopper, Dr. Muriithi and Dr. Pagot.

In place of Dr. Fukuda, the co-sponsors nominate Dr. Noboru Yamada, Director of the Research Institute for Tropical Agriculture, Tokyo, to serve a three-year term. Biographical information about Dr. Yamada is attached to this letter.

The co-sponsors also propose that a place for one more expert be created on TAC, to create a Committee of 12 experts, plus the Chairman. The addition of another place, we believe, will be useful both in making it possible to strengthen TAC's expertise and to keep TAC representative of the various capabilities and perspectives of the Consultative Group itself. It is not proposed, however, to enlarge the Committee beyond this size, lest its working efficiency be impaired. In addition, the co-sponsors appreciate the need of reviewing the composition of TAC from time to time so as to avoid institutionalizing its membership.

For this new place in TAC, the co-sponsors propose the election, for a three-year term, of Professor Dieter Bommer, head of the Institute for Plant Cultivation and Seed Research of the Agricultural Research Center in Braunschweig-Völkenrode, Germany. Biographical information concerning Professor Bommer is attached.

We would be grateful to have the early action of the members of the Consultative Group on these nominations. In order to facilitate preparations for the next meeting of TAC, it would be desirable that the votes of members be received by the Executive Secretary of the Consultative Group, Mr. Harold Graves, not later than June 16.

In case you wonder whether it absorbed most of IRRI's 1972 operating budget I should perhaps add that the cost of the first 3,000 copies was 56 cents per copy. IRRI gets type set for publications of this kind in Australia to insure accuracy and flies it to Hong Kong for printing. I was told that colored plates that cost \$20-\$25 in Hong Kong cost \$175-\$200 on Madison Avenue.



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



This is an attempt to respond to your request for comments concerning how relationships between the International Centers and the Consultative Group, TAC and individual donors may evolve.

Clearly these relationships will be developed by the Institutes and the Consultative Group. Hence, as you indicate, it is important that the Institutes think through how they would like to work and discuss these matters directly with Messrs. Demuth, Graves and others.

From what I sense is evolving my guess is that a senario something like the following may develop.

January - February. Each Center will likely conduct its own internal program review, probably in closed session for its own staff. Or it may include both Institute staff and members of that Institute's Board.

February - March - April. The Institutes will probably hold during this period individual external program reviews. Such reviews may cover the total program of the Center or they may focus on sub-program A in year one, sub-program B in year two, etc. Periodically, perhaps once in five to seven years, in depth review, planning and outlook exercises will probably be held by each of the Institutes. My guess is that these would be somewhat in the model of the IRRI rice outlook and planning exercise for the 1970s perhaps with a somewhat larger input from non-institute scientists. Terms of reference for the external reviews both annual and in depth would presumably be worked out by the Institutes and the Consultative Groups along with TAC. How the review committee was identified, appointed and paid would have to be determined. The Consultative Group might name the review committee from a list of nominees put forward by the Institute. Costs might be borne by the

Institute itself. TAC might have one of its members serve on the review committee. I would suppose that the review committee would prefer to work at least a portion of its time in closed session. On the other hand the need to host observers who represent individual donors is great. Therefore if the external review could be conducted in such a fashion that substantial opportunity existed for observers to come to know the Institutes and their programs, this might conserve Institute staff time. Most donors will seek means whereby they are satisfied that their support is well and appropriately used. To obviate the necessity of hosting multiple review and visiting teams, the Institutes may wish to set a week to ten days for visitors, observers and review activities during which time senior staff members are in residence for this purpose. My presumption is that the external review team would file its report with Institute management and staff as well as with TAC/CG and individual donors.

March - April - May. Probably the TAC group will meet in Rome during this period Normally as I understand it established Institutes will not be invited to this meeting.

During the same March - to May period the Institutes will probably hold meetings of their executive or executive-finance committees of their Boards. The purpose would be to clear the agenda and evolve general policy recommendations for the Board. Observers would not be invited to this meeting with the probable exception of Mr. Graves as Secretary of the Consultative Group.

May - June. During this period I presume that the Institutes will hold their annual meetings of their full Boards. The agenda would normally include the receiving of the Annual Report, careful review of plans and programs for the coming year and adoption of program - budget presentations for the next accounting period. While the Boards might and probably would hold closed sessions, the meetings would be open to observers (present or potential donors).

July - August. During this period the combined meetings formerly called International Centers' Week will presumably be held in Washington. The Consultative Group would, as I understand it, receive the recommendations of TAC as well as reports and presentations from the management of the Centers. The Consultative Group would act on TAC's recommendations and the Centers' requests and presumably take a provisional stance with respect to levels of support to be approved for the coming year. This would be the principal occasion at which the Institutes made their oral and visual program - budget presentations.

October. The Consultative Group would meet again at which time individual members hopefully would make firm pledges with respect to next year's support of the individual Institutes. Only members of the Consultative Group would be present.

November - December. Assuming that the Consultative Group members reached their decisions and were able to report them firmly at the October meeting, the individual Institutes would negotiate their individual grants from the donors during the November - December period with a target of having the grant completed and initial payment in hand by January 1.

You will recognize that the foregoing may depart significantly from the senario that Messrs. Demuth and Graves have in mind. Certainly mechanics of achieving the above timetable remain to be worked out. And when the Institutes and the Consultative Group have visited further, a substantially different senario may be evolved. Because the above deals with a subject of general interest to the Institutes copies of this letter are going to your colleagues.

P.S.

Let us return to the February - March external reviews. It could well be that two groups of external reviewers will visit each institute. Group A would handle the program (research, training, outreach) considerations. Presumably these would be scientist - educators. Group B would conduct an Administrative-financial review. Presumably they would speak to financial management and record keeping, validity of planned budgets within the context of the program. This would begin to sound like a great deal of review and evaluation. There may be better answers. But I anticipate that the C.G. and donors will seek independent certification on financial (budget details and CPA audit) as well as programatic matters.

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
