1. **Alan Heston**, Professor emeritus in the Department of Economics at the University of Pennsylvania, co-founder of the Penn-World Tables, and leading expert on international economic comparisons and PPPs.
2. **Ana Revenga**, Deputy Chief Economist of the World Bank, former Senior Director of the Poverty and Equity Global Practice of the World Bank, and member of the World Bank's Commission on Global Poverty.
3. **Sir Angus Deaton**, 2015 Nobel Prize Laureate in Economics, and Senior Scholar and the Dwight D. Eisenhower Professor of Economics and International Affairs Emeritus at the Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs and the Economics Department at Princeton University.
4. **D. Prasada Rao**, Professor in the School of Economics at the University of Queensland, and leading expert on econometric and statistical methods, time-series analysis, PPPs and price statistics.
5. **Paul Shreyer**, Deputy Chief Statistician of the OECD, a leading expert on the measurement of capital and productivity, measuring non-market activities, national income accounting and price statistics, and former rapporteur of the Stiglitz-Sen-Fitoussi Commission on the Measurement of Economic Performance and Social Progress.
6. **Pronab Sen**, Country Director for the International Growth Center's India Central Programme, former Chief Statistician of India, and head of the panel that reviewed India's new GDP series in 2015.
7. **Robert C. Feenstra**, Professor at the Department of Economics, holder of the C. Bryan Cameron Distinguished Chair in International Economics, Director of the Center for International Data at the University of California - Davis, and leading expert on trade, PPP time series, and big data.
8. **W. Erwin Diewert**, Professor in the Vancouver School of Economics at the University of British Columbia, and leading expert on index numbers, price measurement and productivity.
9. **Walter Radermacher**, Chief Statistician of the European Union and General Director of Eurostat (retiring at the end of 2016), and former Head of the German Statistical Office (Destatis).
10. **Xianchun Xu**, Deputy Commissioner of the National Bureau of Statistics of China (retiring at the end of 2016), and a prominent expert on national income accounting.
