CR-173-EC-1 On January 20, 1970, the International Development Association (IDA), a World Bank affiliate, has extended an interim credit equivalent to \$1.5 million to Ecuador to help provide additional finance for a livestock development program started with a World Bank loan of \$4 million in 1967. The project seeks to increase beef cattle production for domestic consumption and export, by introducing modern techniques and developing standards which could eventually be applied throughout Ecuador.
