

Women navigate discriminatory laws and regulations at every point in their careers, limiting their equality of opportunity.






WOMEN HAVE JUST THREE FOURTHS THE RIGHTS OF MEN

A decade ago, none of these economies received the top score.






HIGHER SCORES MEAN BETTER OUTCOMES FOR WOMEN

16 economies introduced reforms in the last two years, including mandating maternity, paternity, or parental leave.




PAY

12 economies removed restrictions on the jobs that women can work, or introduced equal remuneration for work of equal value.

The lowest-scoring regions saw the most improvement over the last two years.






