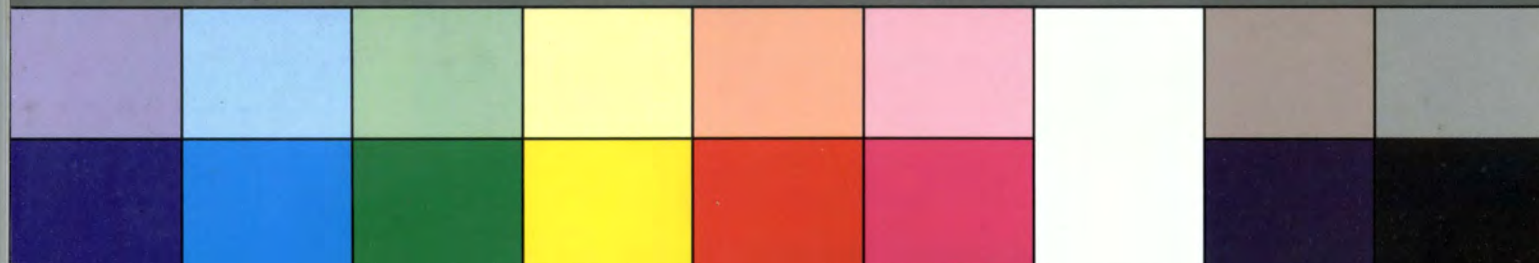

CR-286-EC-1 On February 3, 1972 the Board of Directors of the International Development Association (IDA), a member of the World Bank Group, approved a credit equivalent to \$6.8 million to assist the expansion of electric power supply in Quito, the capital city of Ecuador and one of its main industrial regions. The proceeds will help Empresa Electrica "Quito" (EEQ), the company responsible for the generation and distribution of electricity in Quito and its surrounding area, to finance a program to increase electricity supply by 48 megawatts.

Among those present at the signing of the credit documents on February 15, 1972 were, from left to right: Mr. Virgilio Barco, Executive Director of IDA for Ecuador; The Honorable Alonso Salgado, Minister of Finance of the Republic of Ecuador; Mr. Mohamed Shoaib, Vice President of IDA; Mr. Sixto Duran-Ballen, President of Empresa Electrica Quito S.A. (EEQ); and Mr. Juan Sevilla, General Manager of Empresa Electrica Quito S.A. (EEQ).
